Diversion Program Fundamentals

- 1. Robust contracts w/community behavioral health organizations
 - Monitored by MCAO staff
 - Must consider ability to pay
- 2. Contractors deliver evidence-based programs/principles
- 3. Offenders assessed using the validated Ohio Risk Assessment System (ORAS) which determines an offender's:
 - <u>Overall Level of Risk to Reoffend</u> Low, Moderate, High, Very High
 - <u>Criminogenic Needs</u>
- 4. Monthly statistics and program evaluation

LOW Risk Offenders Go To:

Drug Treatment: Early Intervention Substance Abuse

Education/Treatment

- 2-hour groups, 1x per week for 10 sessions; all sessions must be completed
- Case management services available if needed
- Required drug testing
- Curriculum: Group Treatment for Substance Abuse: A Stages of Change Therapy Model (ten specific lessons for all participants)

OR

TRACK TWO LOW Risk Offenders Go To:

Drug Treatment: Lapse/Relapse Prevention Program

- Geared towards those who have had success in past SA education or treatment, but have returned to substance use
- 2-hour groups, 1x per week for 10 sessions; all sessions must be completed
- Case management services available if needed
- Required drug testing
- Curriculum: SAMHSA: Counselor's Manual for Relapse Prevention with Chemically Dependent Criminal Offenders

TRACK THREE MODERATE Risk (Drug Treatment

- 2-hour groups, 2x
- Required: at least
- Individual counsel
- Required drug test
- Curriculum: Hazelo
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OR

TRACK FOUR HIGH/VERY HIGH Drug Treatment

- 50 sessions in tota week, then stepdo completed
- Required 3-12 ind
- Individual counsel
- Required drug test
- Curriculum: Crimin
- Referrals to inpati



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Therapy Model

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MODERATE to VERY HIGH Risk Offenders with a ²MODERATE to HIGH level of Substance Abuse Criminogenic Need; CN Score: 3,4, 5, or 6

TRACK THREE

MODERATE Risk Offenders Go To:

Drug Treatment – Standard Outpatient Program (SOP)

- 2-hour groups, 2x per week for total of 20-34 sessions; all sessions must be completed
- Required: at least one post-group case management session
- Individual counseling/Case Management services available
- Required drug testing
- Curriculum: Hazelden's *Living in Balance* completion of 12 Core Sessions with supplemental supportive sessions (8 to 22) as needed based upon individual needs.

OR

TRACK FOUR HIGH/VERY HIGH Risk Offenders Go to:

Drug Treatment – Intensive Outpatient (IOP)

- 50 sessions in total, 3-hour groups: Phase I is 3x per week, stepdown to Phase II is 2x per week, then stepdown to Phase III is 1x per week, for up to two years; all sessions must be completed
- Required 3-12 individual sessions
- Individual counseling/Case Management services available
- Required drug testing
- Curriculum: Criminal Conduct and Substance Abuse
- Referrals to inpatient and other higher end services may be possible

TRACK FIVE LOW Risk Offenders Go To:

Cognitive Behavioral Intervention: LOW

- 2-hour groups, 1x per week, for 12 sessions; all sessions must be completed
- Individual counseling/Case Management services available
- Drug testing available
- Curriculum: *Decision Points* (5 lessons and required accompanied activities)

OR

TRACK SIX

MODERATE to HIGH/VERY HIGH Risk Offenders Go To:

Cognitive Behavioral Intervention: MODERATE to VERY HIGH

- 2-hour groups, 2x per week for 25 sessions; all sessions must be completed
- Individual counseling/Case Management services available
- Drug testing available
- Curricula: *Decision Points* (5 lessons and required accompanied activities = 12 sessions); Texas Christian University's Unlock Your Thinking: Open Your Mind (8 sessions) and *Getting Motivated to Change* (5 sessions)
