




Automated Case Assignment – Simple




Automated Case Assignment – Weighted




Workloads — Case Weights Example Homicide = 1000 points ; DWI = 50 points




Workloads – Case Weights Complication Case Type Multipliers




Work queues – Charging Decisions




Work queues – Reminders




Work queues – Caseload




Work queues – Time Entry
