

Black men incarcerated **6x** than white men. Hispanic/Latinx men incarcerated **2.5x** than white men.

Crime rates drop **as people age** yet **10**% of
state prison are
people 55+.

Brain not fully developed until mid-20s

In 2019, more than half (57%) of the prison population served 10+ years.

Recidivism rates **lower**with education,
programming, and
work while
incarcerated.

With more than **11,000** years returned in sentences voided.



ABA Resolution 504

Adopted in August 2023

Urges federal, state, local, territorial, and tribal governments to adopt

Prosecutor-Initiated Resentencing
legislation that permits a court at any time to recall and resentence a person to a lesser sentence upon the recommendation of the prosecutor of the jurisdiction in which the person was sentenced.











We're working on an initiative to examine more **women's cases.**Most incarcerated women are mothers, and women are the fastest-growing prison population.



We started the first **legal clinic** in the country to help
prosecutors do this work.
Now, it's gaining steam in CA
and MN.



With UC Berkeley, we developed the **first data automation tool** to help prosecutors review prison files and make the process more seamless.
